Reverse Racism

"Reverse racism" is **not** a thing: White people control every branch of the federal government; 46 of 50 state governorships; 99% of the banks; 495 of the Fortune 500 companies; every television network, movie company, 6 of the 7 major music companies and every single lawmaking body in the country.

Voting Irregularities

In-person voter fraud is almost nonexistent (<https://tinyurl.com/zm3utot>), but there are completely legal ways to rig an election: Gerrymandering, or changing the composition of the electorate by enacting restrictions on who can vote (e.g., disenfranchising felons: <https://tinyurl.com/p3nrrun>), or at what times (e.g., restricting early/absentee voting: <https://tinyurl.com/gmasnqu>), or the required <https://tinyurl.com/k6faxfw>) ID to vote, or by "arbitrarily" reducing polling sites [cont'd on next page ...]

America's illegal immigrants by the numbers

The Week published an article recently that sheds some light on the topic.

- ~11 million: Estimated number of illegals in the US.
- \$14,387/year: Estimated taxpayer cost for an average illegal immigrant household. (Heritage Foundation)
- ~⅓: Estimated number who have lived here for over 10 years.
- 60%: Number concentrated in six states: CA, TX, IL, NY, NJ, and **Florida**.
- ~8.1 million: Do—or want to—work.
- ~50%: Number who are Mexican; the rest are mostly from Latin America.
- ~7.5%: How many illegals qualify as “removable criminal aliens.” (DHS)
- ~50%: How many pay income taxes.
- \$10.6 billion: How much they contributed in state/local taxes in 2010.
- \$13 billion: How much they paid into

Social Security in 2010.

- 76%: Americans who say illegals are “honest and hardworking.” (PEW)
- 51%: Americans who favor a path to legalization for illegals. (CNN)
- 11%: Americans who favor removal.
- ~\$400–600 billion: Estimated cost to remove every illegal immigrant.
- ~\$11 trillion: Estimated hit to the economy from mass removal.
- The illegal immigrant population has declined steadily since 2007.
- Illegal immigrants do **NOT** qualify for public benefits (TANF, SNAP, SS, etc.).
- Children of illegals **DO** receive public schooling and emergency medical care.
- US-born children of illegals **DO** qualify for public benefits.

Eight years in America: 2009–2016

Metrics indicate improvement over the last 8 years. Unemployment is below 5%, while the GDP and Dow Jones have steadily

increased. So why does it feel like the average citizen has not really experienced any improvement at all?

A recent report details several troubling trends (<https://tinyurl.com/j5nrwsl>):

- Voluntary Workforce Departures. The number of Americans **not** participating in the workforce has increased ~15% since 2009. (<https://tinyurl.com/j46oq4g>)
- Contingent Workforce Growth. Part-time workers now comprise 40% of the total workforce, and that number is

expected to grow to 50% by 2030.

- Low GDP Growth. Economists say the ideal annual rate for US GDP growth is 2–3%, and growth averaged 2% a year in the post-recession recovery period. However, it has stagnated in 2016.
- Anemic wage growth. Median income is about the same today as it was 20 years ago, after adjusting for inflation. (<https://tinyurl.com/go59cn2>)

War on Christianity

Christian persecution is real—just not in the US (<https://tinyurl.com/kovpv29>).

Attacks on the 2nd Amendment

President Obama has signed only 2 gun laws, and both made it *easier* for gun owners to carry weapons (Quora, <https://tinyurl.com/jf2tury>).

Violent Crime

The homicide rate declined 48% (1992–

2010), and murder is *intra-racial* (84% of white murders are white-on-white; 93% of black murders are black-on-black: <https://tinyurl.com/mb29bfa>). Do you question the rationale of *Black Lives Matter*? Consider: unarmed, non-violent black people were killed at 5 times (<https://tinyurl.com/gm2x7j3>) the rate of whites in 2015; and from 2010–12 young black males were 21 times more likely than their white counterparts to be killed by police (ProPublica, <https://tinyurl.com/mfw73kb>).
