To become a U.S. citizen students must pass a U.S. English Language Test and a U.S. Civics Test during their naturalization interview. This class is designed to improve ordinary English language skills in reading, writing, listening and speaking. Students prepare for the civics test by learning about the history, laws and customs of the U.S. government.
